**TOWN HALL GYMKHANA | BMC to redevelop municipal sports complex located in front of its HQ; bid deadline Aug 28, pre-bid meet on Aug 18**

# With no takers, sports complex re-tendered

The BMC on Thursday re-tendered a proposal to redevelop a municipal sports complex located in front of its headquarters into a state-of-the-art 'Town Hall Gymkhana' (THG) as it failed to attract any bidders.

The new building will have a ground floor plus five storeys, housing a municipal council hall and a restaurant. Tourists can access a rooftop viewing gallery via glass capsule lifts. A glass dome, designed to complement nearby heritage structures, will offer panoramic views of the area.

The bid submission deadline has been set by the BMC for August 28, with a pre-bid meeting scheduled for August 18.

The area encompassing Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus (CSMT), the BMC headquarters, and the Central Railway's administrative offices is one of Mumbai's most iconic heritage zones. While the BMC installed a selfie point to showcase this legacy, the precinct lacked facilities offering immersive or panoramic views. To fill this gap, the BMC planned the development of THG featuring unique architectural elements and invited tenders on April 24. However, after months of inviting bids, the



project did not attract any interest, confirmed an official from the BMC's building construction department.

The concept for the structure was developed by the BMC's architectural department.

The planned building will have a ground floor plus five additional floors, housing a municipal council hall

and a restaurant. Tourists can reach the rooftop viewing gallery via glass capsule lifts, offering closer views of the surrounding heritage buildings.

A senior civic official said, "A glass dome designed to complement the heritage architecture will provide visitors with panoramic views of the area. THG will offer parking for around 60 vehicles across two basement levels. This design preserves the visual integrity of the surrounding heritage precinct while providing tourists and the public with panoramic views."

## EOW all set to file supp chargesheet in bank scam

The Mumbai Police's Economic Offences Wing (EOW) is set to file a supplementary chargesheet in the Rs122-crore New India Cooperative Bank scam. The new chargesheet will name four additional accused. They are Pawan Amarsingh Jaiswal and three persons linked to auditor firms – Laxminarayan Nayak, Abhijit Deshmukh, and Subhash Indrajit Mogal.

Sources said the supplementary chargesheet runs into 2,000 pages. It also names former bank chairman Hiren Bhanu and his wife Gauri Bhanu as wanted accused.

The EOW investigation has revealed that Hiren Bhanu allegedly received Rs24 crore and Gauri Bhanu Rs2 crore from the bank, allegedly sanctioned by then General Manager Hitesh Mehta. In May this year, the EOW had filed an extensive 12,634-page chargesheet against 10 persons, including Mehta, who is accused of facilitating the fraudulent transactions. The Bhanu couple were declared absconders in the initial chargesheet. Blue corner notices have been issued in an effort to trace them.

## Yogi film now before revising panel

The Bombay High Court on Thursday directed the makers of the film 'Ajey: The Untold Story of a Yogi' to approach the revising committee of the Central Board of Film Certification (CBFC) after the Board refused to certify the film. The movie is reportedly

inspired by a book based on the life of Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath.

A bench of Justices Revati Mohite-Dere and Neela Gokhale directed the CBFC to inform the filmmakers of the objectionable scenes or dialogues by August 11. The makers must then update the court on August 12 about the changes they intend to make.

The next hearing is scheduled for August 14.

Earlier, the Court had asked the CBFC to screen the film and issue a reasoned order. On Thursday, CBFC's counsel submitted that the Board had done so and that the filmmakers were free to appeal before the revising committee. He stated that the concerns were not just about

the portrayal of a constitutional figure, but also about potentially "defamatory" and "objectionable" content.

However, the film's producers, Samrat Cinematics, contended that the CBFC failed to specify which scenes were problematic, despite being required to do so under Section 4(2) of the Cinematograph Act.

## AI to choose 25,000 for start-up training

The state government has launched a new scheme titled 'Chief Minister's Mega Fund for Entrepreneurship and Innovation'. As part of the initiative, 20 new short-term courses will begin on September 15 at Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) and will focus on personality development and supplementary skills.

There are currently 30 lakh technically educated youth in Maharashtra. All of them will be contacted via email and assessed through AI-based evaluation tools. From this

pool, five lakh candidates will be shortlisted, and through additional screening processes such as competitive exams, hackathons, and assessments, one lakh candidates will be selected. Ultimately, 25,000 candidates will receive technical support, financial assistance, and training, with the goal of developing them into successful entrepreneurs and startup founders.

Skill development, employment, entrepreneurship, and innovation minister Mangal Prabhat Lodha said, "The Maharashtra Start-up, Entrepreneurship, and Innovation Policy 2025 has been approved and will soon

be officially implemented."

The policy sets an ambitious five-year vision, targeting the creation of 1.25 lakh entrepreneurs and the formal recognition of 50,000 start-ups, as reported by the FPJ earlier.

A key feature of the scheme is financial assistance in the form of loans ranging from Rs5 lakh to Rs10 lakh. A Rs500 crore corpus fund will be established over five years to support these efforts.

Lodha also announced that the 'Olympian Khashaba Jadhav Paramparik Krida Mahakumbha' will be organised in Mumbai in memory of Punyashlok Ahilyadevi Holkar.

The event will be held from August 13-22 at the Jam Saheb Mukadam Government ITI grounds in Kurla. The mega event aims to revive traditional sports such as Lezim, Phugdi, Lagori, Vitti Dandu, and other games from the Maratha era.
